

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

This week I will go to the retreat house in Ipswich, Massachusetts to participate in the retreat for priests in the Diocese of Worcester. I usually participate in the retreat set up by the Office of Ongoing Priestly Formation and usually find it very beneficial.

This means that we will not celebrate mass at St. Joseph Church from Monday through Friday. Please pray for me and the other priests from the diocese who will be making the retreat. I will remember you in my prayers while I am on retreat.

May is a month dedicated to Mary. The popularity of devotion to Mary is evident from the beginning of the Church. The evangelists and the Fathers of the Church wrote about her in the Gospels and early Church literature. Mary was very popular in the Eastern Churches. Our Western Roman Church borrowed much from the Eastern Churches when she became popular in the West.

I expect that many parishioners have fond memories of Marian Devotions. Most parishes celebrated a crowning of Mary's statue early in the month. People carried Mary's statue in processions and prayed for her intercession. Some parishes set up or decorated altars dedicated to Mary in May. Marian devotions brought people together for prayer.

Such devotions fell out of the parish schedule because people stopped coming. Some pastors expected people to come every day to the devotions and when the number of people dwindled, they wondered why.

While the devotions fell out of fashion, the love of Our Blessed Mother should not diminish. I know that many parishioners pray the rosary often. The rosary is a magnificent prayer that celebrates spirituality on different levels.

Other parishioners have found beautiful prayers in books that elevate their spirits to the presence of Mary. The Magnificat, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord..." from the Gospel according to Luke 1:46-55 is Mary's contribution to the Prayer of the Church for many centuries. Other



people enjoy the Litany to Mary that asks her to "Pray for us." It addresses her by the many titles that the Church assigned to her through the centuries.

She is important to this parish because she is the spouse of Saint Joseph, our patron.

Mary is a special gift to the Church. Jesus has great reverence for his mother and shares her with us. May we open our hearts to her in prayer.



Second Sunday of Easter



It is a centuries-old custom of Catholics to dedicate the month of May to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The month of May is always part of the Easter season, the fifty days we celebrate in the liturgy the Resurrection of Our Lord, a time also of awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The celebration of May as a Marian month fits well with the liturgical celebrations of Easter and Pentecost as we recall Mary's great joy in her Son's victory over death as well as her presence with the apostles in the upper room prayerfully awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

It is good to consider the faith of Mary. At the Visitation, Elizabeth said to Mary: *Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled*. When we think of our Blessed Mother, we recognize that she is indeed *blessed*, not only because she was the Mother of Jesus, but because she believed in the Lord's words. She believed with all her heart and said "yes" to become the Mother of the Messiah and Son of God. She allowed herself to be led by God's grace throughout her life, a life rooted in a deep faith in God. She became her Son's first and most perfect disciple.

In our pilgrimage of faith, we walk always with Mary at our side. She is our model of faith and she helps us with her prayers to live by faith. She teaches us to believe as she believed.


