
Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

I expect that parishioners have read and studied the book, *What Christians Believe*, that was written by Bishop Robert Barron and produced by his Word on Fire ministry. The parish ordered 100 copies and we ran out of them.

Last year Bishop Barron wrote a book to prepare people for the Holy Year on prayer. Parishioners have questioned me about prayer. Some feel they are not praying well. Others think their prayer doesn't bring them the consolation or satisfaction they seek. They want to know what they can do differently to engage God in a meaningful and open dialogue.

Bishop Barron's book, *An Introduction to Prayer*, is an answer to these kinds of questions. I still remember the questions and answers about prayer in the *Baltimore Catechism* that was used in elementary education when I was young. Bishop Barron's book takes the reader down the same road of exploration in the conversation that people have with God that we commonly call prayer that the Catechism explained.

This book is very much like Bishop Barron's other books. He goes into detail. He gives historical background. He includes personal insights. He explains doctrinal concepts. He treats the subject extensively, often going slower than my comfort level, but he's not writing for me. He writes for the person of faith who seeks a better understanding of what they believe and have not had the benefit of a seminary education.



I ordered a number of copies of *An Introduction to Prayer* for our parish. Once again, Word on Fire Ministry made a great offer that I found hard to refuse. The price was low and it included shipping. When they arrive I will place them on the table in the rear of the church near the main door. When you take one please make a commitment to read at least most of it and feel free to pass it around to other people in your family or neighborhood.

Some parishioners wish to donate to this effort. They want to pay for their book because they feel funny taking it from the church. Parishioners who wish to donate should place their donation in an envelope and mark it with "Introduction to Prayer" and place it in the basket with their regular envelope. When the books arrive please enjoy your copy. I hope it will help you enrich your conversation with God.

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord – August 6

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #554:

From the day Peter confessed that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, the Master "began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things... and be killed, and on the third day be raised." Peter scorns this prediction, nor do the others understand it any better than he. In this context the mysterious episode of Jesus' Transfiguration takes place on a high mountain, before three witnesses chosen by himself: Peter, James and John. Jesus' face and clothes become



dazzling with light, and Moses and Elijah appear, speaking "of his departure, which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem". A cloud covers him and a voice from heaven says: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"


A Message from Bishop McManus ...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

For more than 40 years, and in some countries more than 70 years, communism ruled Central and Eastern European countries and the Soviet Union's many republics. Rapid, sometimes harsh transitions to market economies led to ongoing attitudes of materialism that have left poor and dependent people, including children, seniors, and people with disabilities, particularly vulnerable.

After decades of persecution, Catholics of the Armenian rite, the Chaldean rite, and the Latin rite have experienced a new era of freedom since Georgia became independent from the Soviet Union. These communities have set about rebuilding the Church, but poverty and remote, rural locations have made this work very difficult. Over 30% of Georgians live below the poverty line - children, the sick and the disabled are the most affected.

Catholics in the village of Arali kept the faith during years of persecution and now that their church is restored and they have a priest, they are able to celebrate Mass as a community. With assistance from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. Catholics in Georgia are able to rebuild churches, provide medical care for the poor, and to pass on the faith to the




next generation so that the Church can once again thrive where once it was persecuted.
